	For two driver teams no driver can participate in sessions that are back to back.			
	Session One – 10 minute session, all drivers.			
	Session Two – 8 minute session, Top 20 karts from Session One.

	Session Three – Top Ten Shoot out – Top Ten Karts from Session two, in order of the slowest kart in the 10 th position from Session Two, through to the fastest kart in 1 st position from Session Two.
Starting Grid	Will be as per the Endurance Regulations – Section 4E.11.7.

	The following breaches will also result in a Rear of Grid starting position:
	 Karts still within Pit Lane or the Paddock when pit lane exit closes (refer to event timetable below).

Race	The Event will consist of one (1) Race only.

	Teams must complete all compulsory pit stops by the time the leader greets the chequered flag or a
	three (3) Lap Post Race Penalty, for each CPS not completed, will be applied.
	Teams are required to complete at least one CPS in accordance with the following conditions.
	a) At least one CPS cannot "commence" until 5hrs 15 minutes race duration has elapsed on the official
	timing screen.
	b) Pit Stops commence when the kart crosses the Pit In Loop at Pit Entry.
	c) The stop at the completion of the race is not counted as a CPS.
Mechanical Meat	When a kart transitions Pit Lane as directed by the officials via the issuance of the Black and Orange
Ball Flag	Mechanical Flag, that transition of Pit Lane will be counted a CPS. Teams must rectify the mechanical
	issue that generated the issuance of the Mechanical Flag and adhere to the Minimum Pit Lane Time liste
	on the Minimum Pit Lane Transition Board prior to returning to the circuit to continue racing.
	Should the issuance of the Mechanical flag occur at such a time that teams need to make an extra stop(s
	in addition to those stated as "compulsory" teams must do so and ensure they are within the rules state
	in these regulations to be classified as a finisher.
	A reminder that all transitions of pit lane, whether compulsory or not must be in accordance with the
	Minimum Pit Stop Transition Times stated in these regulations.
Kart Recovery	A recovery vehicle will be used at this event.
•	Any Kart recovery via a trolley or recovery vehicle during the race will count as a CPS.
Pit Lane	Speed limits will apply as per the Endurance Regulations – Section 4E.11.3.
Transition Times	There are two Minimum Pit Lane Transition Times at this event that will apply under Section 4E.12.4
	Stop - Go Penalty = 60 Seconds
	Compulsory Pit Stop = 110 Seconds
Pit Lane Closure	A "Pit Lane Closed" board or light may be used at the discretion of the Clerk of Course. This will be show
	prior to the Pit Lane entry. Teams that enter the pits whilst the "Pit Lane Closed" board or light is
	displayed will not have that pit stop counted towards that karts CPS total.
Pit Lane Exit Line	Karts waiting to exit pit lane must wait behind the taped line adjacent to the pit transition timing screen
	A kart or karts that are identified as waiting beyond the taped line and blocking the exit of pit lane will
	have: First Offence – 60 Second Time Penalty
	Further Offences – 10 Lap Time Penalty

	Penalties will be applied Post Race.
Refuelling After	After the completion of Official Practice all refuelling must be administered by the Fuel Marshal from the
Official Practice	4SKA Fuel Rig. Teams are not required to empty their tanks after Official Practice prior to Refuelling.
	Karts are permitted to return to the paddock area after obtaining their race fuel.
	Once the race begins, teams cannot refuel their karts until the fuel bay opens 30 minutes into the race.
Refuelling During	There are no minimum refuelling stops for this event.
The Race.	Teams are Permitted to Re Fuel at any CPS so long as the fuel bay is not closed.
	The fuel bay is closed for the first thirty (30) minutes and last thirty (30) minutes of the race.
	There is no fuel board to reserve the fuel bay.
	Teams are permitted to queue for fuel but must not block access to pit lane traffic.
	When refuelling only the driver and one (1) pit crew is permitted in the fuel bay.
	Karts can be pushed to the driver change area to be restarted.
Driver ID	Each Driver in a Team must have a different colour patch visibly attached to their driving suit for Driver
	Identification purposes. Colour patches are available from the race secretaries table at each event.
	Teams failing to comply will be given one warning, and for any further breaches the kart will be shown
	the Black and Orange meatball flag and the situation must be rectified.

CHAMPIONSHIP POSITIONS - BREAKING A TIE - ALL CLASSES:

At the conclusion of the 2024 4SKA Endurance Championship should any teams be tied on points, the following system will be utilised to break the tie and form the final championship order. The team that meets the following requirements first will be elevated above a team finishing on the same number of points:

a) The team with the most wins in the 2024 4SKA Endurance Championship in their class - if still tied refer to point b)





- b) The team with the most 2nd places in the 2024 4SKA Endurance Championship in their class if still tied refer to point c)
- c) ... and so on until the tie is broken.

TROPHIES & PRIZES:

Point scores, trophies and prizes can only be determined once all post-race penalties have been applied. Trophies will be awarded to:

 1^{st} , 2^{nd} & 3^{rd} Outright placings , 1^{st} , 2^{nd} & 3^{rd} position in the Champ Class, 1^{st} , 2^{nd} & 3^{rd} position in the Club Class. The Hard Charger Award (\$50) will be awarded to the team that makes up the most positions from their qualifying position to the end of the race courtesy of Westglass .

Pole Position for Outright, Champ Class & Club Class will be awarded \$100 each courtesy of Scarcella Transport.

E. MEETING CONDITIONS

DRIVE THROUGH PENALTY:

Teams that fail to comply will be given a ten (10) Lap Timing Penalty.

TYRES:

The permitted Tyres for this event are Dunlop SL1A (Slick) & Dunlop KT12-SLW2 (Wet).

Any number of Tyres may be used in Practice Sessions.

Once Qualifying commences, only one (1) set of the prescribed Dry Weather Tyres, and two sets of the prescribed Wet Weather Tyres may be used for the duration of the Event.

At the discretion of the Chief Scrutineer tyres may be marked, scanned, and recorded.

CONTROL FUEL:

The Control Fuel for this meeting is Ampol / Caltex 95.

The Fuel must be purchased from any Ampol/Caltex or Woolworths-Ampol/Caltex service station

Teams must supply twenty three (23) litres of Fuel for each Kart and be purchased no more than two days prior to the meeting. Proof of purchase of the Fuel must be retained and produced to the Chief Scrutineer or Fuel Marshal if requested. The Race Fuel is to be left adjacent to the Fuel Rig prior to, or immediately after Driver Sign-on.

REPLACEMENT ENGINES:

Replacement engines must have their engine number and tag information included on the karts scrutineering form. If not included on the scrutineering form the team must supply this information to the Chief Scrutineer once an engine change is affected.

MECHANICAL BREAK DOWN AREA:

The lubricating of chains and any repairs or adjustments that require the use of tools must be performed beyond the pit gate, in the paddock area.

TECHNICAL:

All Engines must be sealed with additional approved security seals to the cylinder head and flywheel/fan cover. The engine, clutch and engine accessories must comply with the Four Stroke Karting Association of NSW 2023 Supplementary Engine Technical Specification, Document ID: 4SKANSW2023SETSREV05

Rule T.2.8 (c) does not apply to this event. Nylon cable ties may be used to provide secondary retention of the nose cone clips. The cable ties may be placed in any position on the clips including the lower section holding the lever to the tension adjustment bolt. (NOTE: Rule change request submitted 10/08/2022)

Rule T.2.13. Metallic rear bars are not permitted for use at this event.

Rule T.2.14 (c). Additional holes are permitted at this event for the sole purpose of mounting chain guard strips and or lights to the device.

Rule 4E.10.1 Communications equipment may be installed in or on the helmet. The fixing of such items or devices to the helmet must not cause or result in a deterioration of the structural integrity of the helmet.

During the race, nylon cable ties and or cloth reinforced tape (race tape) may be used to effect temporary "on the run" repairs.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Rule 4E.10.1 Devices, systems or items which provide for data transmission to or from the Kart and/or Driver are permitted for use at this event.

The ability for every <u>driver</u> to <u>directly</u> receive Race Communications from Race Control, whilst on track, is a requirement for this event. If it is determined that a <u>driver</u> does not have the ability to <u>directly</u> receive Race Communications from Race Control, whilst on track, at the discretion of the Clerk of Course, may result in a "Mechanical Black Flag" being issued to that kart requiring that kart to return to the pits to have the issue rectified. Multiple offences by the same kart/team may result in a Stop-Go Penalty being issued.

F. CLUB/TRACK REQUIREMENTS

MEDICAL SERVICES:

KART RETRIEVAL:

Retrieval of Karts is at the discretion of the Clerk of Course.

Pit Crew must only enter the Race Track area when permitted by the Grid Marshall or Clerk of Course, and then only if wearing a HIGH VISIBILITY Safety Vest or Clothing on the upper torso.

ANIMALS:

Subject to the applicable laws which may govern the access of animals, no animals are allowed anywhere within the Track precinct unless they are appropriately restrained and managed by a competent and capable person. At their discretion, the Safety Officer may require an animal to be further restrained or removed from the venue.

OTHER:

No dumping of Fuel or Tyres, please make your own arrangements.

No unlicensed driving of motor vehicles permitted at the Track.

No Kart engine starts any day before 8.00am or during Drivers Briefing.

Please keep the Ambulance gate/entrance clear at all times.
